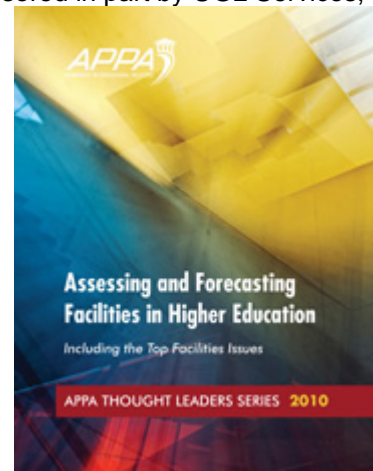

Updated Carnegie Classifications Show Increase in For-Profits, Change in Traditional Landscape

Two of the most striking changes in higher education in the United States are reflected in the latest update of the Carnegie Classifications of Institutions of Higher Education, released today by The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching. There has been a dramatic increase in the number of private, for-profit institutions and an increase in the number of institutions whose instructional programs focus on professional fields like business, health, education and law.

- Compared to 2005, when the Classifications were last updated, there are 483 newly classified institutions in the 2010 Classifications (from a universe of 4,633). The majority of the new institutions—77 percent—are from the private for-profit sector. The growth in public institutions and private not-for-profit institutions has been minimal, accounting for only 4 percent and 19 percent of the newly classified institutions respectively.
- Within the Undergraduate Instructional Program Classification, there has been a significant increase (115 institutions, a 17 percent increase from 2005) in the number of “Professional focus” and “Professions plus arts & sciences” institutions—institutions that awarded more than 60 percent of bachelor’s degree in professional fields.

Say Farewell to the 100-Watt Incandescent Lamp: New Lighting Efficiency Rules Take Effect Nationwide January 1, 2012

Prepare to say goodbye to the 100-watt "general-service" incandescent bulb. In less than one year - as of January 1, 2012 - it will be a violation of the Energy Independence and Security Act (EISA) of 2007 (Public Law 110-140) to import the bulbs to the United States or to manufacture them there. In California, state law banned the bulb as of January 1, 2011. The phase-out will help the nation significantly reduce electrical consumption and the greenhouse-gas emissions associated with the production of some electricity. [Learn more](#).
