



Purpose

What are the consequences, risks, implications of each option? 7. Can you discuss the problem with the affected parties before you make your decision? 8. Is it balanced? Is it fair to all concerned in the short term as well as the long term? 9. How will the decision make you feel about yourself? Could you disclose without qualms your decision or action to your boss, other employees, the newspaper, your family? 10. What is your decision?
